BARRY BLUESTONE is Russell B. and Andr e B. Stearns Trustee Professor of Political Economy at Northeastern University. He is also Director of the Center for Urban and Regional Policy. In 1982, he published *The Deindustrialization of America* (co-authored with Bennett Harrison) which analyzed the restructuring of American industry and its economic and social impact on workers and communities. His latest book is *The Boston Renaissance: Race, Space, and Economic Change in an American Metropolis*, published by the Russell Sage Foundation. It recounts the industrial and demographic revolution in post-World War II Boston and its impact on racial and ethnic attitudes, residential segregation, and the labor market success of whites, blacks, and Latinos.

The Center has developed a multi-media Boston Renaissance Resource Kit to share information and make it easy for students, journalists, community organizations and others to tap into knowledge about the region.
